700-800 AD Frankish/Saxon/Dane

1. Names

- Lists of masculine and feminine given names suitable for early Germanic personae, taken from Gregory of Tours' *History of the Franks* and from *Two Lives of Charlemagne*, published by Penguin Classics. - A large collection of men's and women's names taken from a number of fine sources. For each name, the author indicates the centuries and regions in which he found it, how many instances he found, variant spellings, and which sources he consulted. He includes an article on customs in using and construction Dutch names and some useful discussion of how spellings changed over time in the section *Variations through the centuries and between regions*. The discussion of bynames breaks down the usage of bynames by century, social class, and gender; and shows what kinds of bynames were used by men and women in each class. His sources are rather varied, and some are not entirely reliable as sources of spellings used in Dutch; but his notes make it easy to identify the source of a particular name. - 780-856 AD. **Rabanus Maurus**. The, "Teacher of Germany". Studied under Alcuin. Wrote the encyclopedia, "The Natures of Things", and many other books. Managed the Abby School at Fulda. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Rabanus_Maurus
- 777-785 AD. **Widukind**. Leader of the Saxons, and Chief opponent of Charlemagne. After 10 yrs of war with Charlemagne, Widukind surrenders, gets baptized and retires to an unknown abbey. <https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Widukind>
- Great list of Viking kings, and Yarls separated by sources. Of significance is **Rorik** (Horik) **Godfredson** who pulled a "Rollo", by invading the Rhine, taking Dorestad, then was awarded a fief by Frankia's, Louis the Pious, to protect the Rhine from other invaders with limited success. **Herald Klak** (Rorik's brother/uncle?) who lived at Charlemagne's court for some time, and **Godfred** (Rorik's father) who invaded Hamburg-Schlesvig.

- 778-840 AD **Louis the Pious**. Son of Charlemagne, ruler of the Franks. He divides the kingdom between his sons, and they start a civil war, ending the stability Charlemagne created, the end of an era. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Louis_the_Pious

10. Important Events

- Charlemagne starts to invest heavily into Monasteries in NW France. One Abby has 300 Monks, 100 students, 110 knights with their own chapel, and 300 peasants-servants. The Abby of St. Martin of Tours is worked by 20,00 surfs. The Centula St. Riquier Abby has 300 monks and 100 clerks paying 247 for Karl's health and salvation in 3 shifts.
- 30 year war to convert the Pagan Saxons to Christianity and bring it into the Frankia Empire. 18 engagements, 1.6 battles a year. Written in Period. Annales regni Francorum. <http://deremilitari.org/2013/06/medieval-warfare-in-the-reign-of-charlemagne/>
- 772 AD Karl cuts down the Irminsul tree central to Saxon Religion. Same as Scandinavian Yggdrasil tree. <https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Irminsul>
- 800 AD. Karl Saved Rome and Pope Leo from the Lombard's, He then becomes Emperor of the newly conceived Holy Roman Empire.
- Major inventions happen around 800 AD. 3 crop rotation (Wheat, Rye, and one Fallow). Metal tools like the turn plow. The crank, which leads to rotary grindstones, the Hurdy Gurdy, and water wheels. Horse shoes, saddles, plow, and stirrups, which leads to Calvary, and Chivalry knights.
- In 845 Saracens Muslims invade Spain.

11. Artists (Paintings)

- Echternach Gospels created by Willibrord. From Lindesfarn, spent his life trying to convert the Danes, Created Hiberno-Saxon style of Illumination in Mainland Europe, saved Lindisfarne, and Durham Gospels from Viking invasion. - Karl Ordinarily spoke Old German, but was fluent in Latin and a little Greek, was fond of music, had his own boys' choir. Collected old Frankish Ballads (most were destroyed by his son, Louis the Pious). Compiled the German Language.

- King Karl of the Franks, was passionate about education and music. He ordered all monks to copy books and treatises in music theory. *Musica Enchiridis* tried to establish musical rules across several of the Frankish cultures Karl ruled over. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Musica_enchiridis
